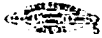

Brothers & Sisters:

Please be advised that Union dues are \$2.00 per month while on layoff. **It is the responsibility of EVERY member to make sure these dues are paid on a monthly basis.** ANYONE **NOT** paying dues for a period of two months or longer is subject to be “lapsed”, meaning you will lose all recall rights back to your job at Amphenol.

There are several ways to pay your dues:

1. If you are laid off and do NOT work the majority of the month you will have a “credit” balance which will be used to pay your out of work dues. It is **YOUR** responsibility to make sure you have a sufficient credit balance to cover your monthly dues payments. You can find out what, if any, credit balance you have by calling the Union Office at **607-563-7221** on Friday afternoons when Secretary-Treasurer Cindy Stacy has office hours.
2. By paying in person at the Union Hall at 25 Sherman Avenue, Sidney, NY, Friday afternoons between the hours of 12:00pm – 4:00pm. On the rare occasion the office is closed on Friday afternoon, or on any other day of the week, payments can be dropped in the mail slot on the right hand side of the front door. Payments should be placed in an envelope with your name and clock number on it (*please make checks or money orders payable to IAM Local Lodge #1529*).
